PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Culinary Arts Program

- Hands-on classroom and kitchen training by certified instructors for 180 students annually
- Three kitchens - hot foods, pastry and catering
- Catering venture will generate revenue for future operations
- Continuing partnership with New Jersey Juvenile Justice Commission, the United Way and Local 54

Automotive Program

- Training in basic mechanic's skills by certified teaching staff for 20 students each semester
- Three classrooms and four work bays provide ample learning space
- Classroom automobile provided by Holman Enterprises

- State-of-the-art classrooms to serve up to 90 preschoolers
- Teaching opportunities; preparatory training and continuing education opportunities
